The Auto Trader Community Fund was launched in April 2016 to support grassroots community groups based in any of the ten boroughs of Greater Manchester.

In 2016, Auto Trader decided to demonstrate a commitment to supporting its staff and the wider community by working with Forever Manchester to “make a difference” in the local community.

The results have seen a team of Auto Trader colleagues meet on a regular basis to consider a range of funding applications while enjoying the benefits of supporting local projects. They have visited, volunteered and even made films with some of the groups to capture the impact of the amazing work that goes on in our communities.

As a result, the Auto Trader Community Fund, which offers awards of up to £1,000, has provided **£304,686** in funding to support **327** community projects, benefitting **140,935** people.

In addition, every Christmas, Auto Trader host a Christmas Party at their First Street offices, where around 100 people from local community groups are invited to join them for a hearty Christmas lunch and lots of fun. (see cover photo)

Due to lockdown restrictions their 2020 and 2021 Christmas Parties were postponed, but this didn't prevent them from bringing cheer to local communities.

Working with Forever Manchester's Community Builders, they helped deliver Christmas gifts to community projects in Ardwick and Wythenshawe in the fabulously unique Forever Manchester camper van, which was also kindly funded by Auto Trader.

Helen Robinson, Diversity, Inclusion and Engagement Manager, Auto Trader said: “We were so thrilled to still be able to work with Forever Manchester to provide some festive cheer to our communities even during this challenging time. Christmas can be a lonely period for many people, and we knew how important it was to continue to do what we can, but in a safe and still, enjoyable way.”

Auto Trader's people regularly participate in Forever Manchester fundraising events such as Forever Football 7s, Forever Funny Comedy Night, the Great Manchester 10k Run and October Cheer Fest. Members of their team have also volunteered in Forever Manchester's pop-up shop.

Between 2016-2022 Auto Trader has also kindly sponsored the Captain Manchester Award at our Annual Birthday Party. They have also sponsored Forever Manchester's online Advent Calendar that featured inspiring local community groups. They have also sponsored and competed in the Forever Football 7s Tournament every year since 2018.

Nick Massey, Chief Executive of Forever Manchester, said: "Auto Trader demonstrates fantastic social investment and commitment to its local community, recognising that, as a business, it's important to give back and provide opportunities for its neighbours to lead happier, healthier lives. The Auto Trader Community Fund welcomes applications from grassroots community groups based in any of the ten boroughs of Greater Manchester.

The Fund aims to encourage and support grassroots community organisations. This means small, community-based and locally controlled groups that manage themselves, encourage people to get involved as volunteers and who just need a bit of financial help to be able to work with their community in the way they'd like.

Applicants must be based in one of the ten boroughs of Greater Manchester and have an annual income of less than £50,000.

Auto Trader Powers the Forever Manchester Camper Van

In 2019, Auto Trader donated money and their expertise to help Forever Manchester buy and refurbish a Camper Van to help expand the charity's support of community activity across Greater Manchester.

A fundamental part of Forever Manchester's approach to working in communities is to identify, connect and showcase the people, community groups, organisations and physical spaces that exist in an area. By discovering what interests and passions people have, we work closely with residents to turn their great ideas into reality, helping to make a real difference to the lives of others in the local community.

Nick Massey, CEO at Forever Manchester said "We are always looking at ways to reach more people and expand our support. When we shared the idea of using a Camper Van as a quirky mobile meeting space, Auto Trader stepped-in to help; not only to support sourcing through their website but also donating cash to purchase it and pay for the refurbishment."

Former Auto Trader CEO Trevor Mather, who became Forever Manchester's President in July 2017 added

"When I heard their brilliant idea of having a Camper Van to engage with more people, it was a no brainer that we should help. One of our core values at Auto Trader is all about encouraging our people to think about the community where they live and what they can do to enrich their local community to be better. By providing our expertise, time and money towards this project, not only are we living and breathing our values we are also doing our bit to support community activity across the region."

The Forever Manchester branded Volkswagen Camper was ready to hit the streets in March 2020, but due to Covid lockdown measures, it had to wait a few months, but in the meantime, it served as a perfect 'home office' for a couple of members of the Forever Manchester team.

The custom-fitted Camper, which can seat up to six people and has tea and coffee facilities, allows the Forever Manchester team to chat with local people over a brew and a biscuit without having to worry about the region's unpredictable weather.

The Camper is also used at community get togethers and fundraising events, as well as helping to raise awareness of Forever Manchester across the whole of Greater Manchester.

Captain Manchester Awards

Stockport User Friendly Fellowship

Based at Stepping Hill Hospital's Mental Health Unit, the Stockport User Friendly Fellowship (STUFF) is a user-led self-help organisation founded by mental health service users wishing to address a lack of support for people like themselves.

Every year, a team of core members and regular volunteers provide support for over 300 people living with mental health issues, alcohol dependency, substance abuse/misuse or homelessness, each year.

A recent Queens Award for Voluntary Service recipient and Forever Manchester Community Group of the Year winner, STUFF take a person-centred approach by providing a safe environment where people can be heard, but not judged, by those with the experience of finding themselves in similar situations.

During the pandemic STUFF received the highest number of referrals in their entire history, witnessing a sharp rise in the number of people affected by domestic violence and instances of those with alcohol/substance issues relapsing.

"This award generated a positive feeling to know we were believed in and that our idea was seen as a good one. It also meant we could extend our support to include everyone in our communities. Without it, we wouldn't have been able to deliver this project on the scale we were able to. It helped in supporting our volunteers, some still learning English, to deliver vital support at what was a very difficult time for people."



Bloco Mente

Bloco Mente is a community-based Samba Reggae percussion band based in Tameside. The group meets weekly to learn percussive music from around the world, sharing it with local people through public performances.

They also actively support community events such as carnivals, festivals, sporting events and parades. Together the band play drums, surdos, snare and percussion instruments to create an amazing and thrilling sound.

The group's members cover all ages and are from all walks of life. They have a variety of health and social needs ranging from low level mental health issues to heart disease, limiting illnesses, ADHD, Autism and those previously experiencing social isolation. Providing opportunities to meet regularly and make new friends really helps. Bloco Mente regard themselves as a family that support and look after each other and have fun together.

"Support from Forever Manchester has allowed our group to bring Samba to Tameside and we felt so pleased to receive this award. As a self-funded community group, the award made a huge difference and enabled us to continue meeting, learning and entertaining our local community.

Without it, we would have struggled to keep going and would not have been able to reach a milestone birthday. Our volunteers are always inspired to give that little bit more when they find out we have been awarded funds because we all love playing Samba and equally value what Forever Manchester does for our local communities."



Theatre of the Senses

Established in 2012 and brought together by virtue of personal mental health experiences, Theatre of the Senses look to focus on sharing and combining such life experiences with positive ways of staying well.

The group was set up to provide people with opportunities to express themselves in a safe setting through dance, drama and music with an emphasis placed on the idea of multi-sensory performance.

Though only a small group, Theatre of the Senses are proud of the work they do and hope to be able to expand to help and involve more people in the future. They currently have 30 members and of these, none have returned to hospital and two members have been able to take up full time employment and reduce their medication.

“We were both excited and delighted to get this award, and grateful for the opportunity to put our ideas and projects into action. We saw it as an encouraging vote of confidence in us and in what we do. Without this funding we simply could not operate or run activities including reopening of our community café.

Autistic people are particularly vulnerable to mental health issues, especially resulting from isolation and lack of acceptance, without the award, our autistic members may have lost existing friends and been deprived of the company of others.

Your dedication to social improvement and the development of community is admirable.”



Friends of Horwich Memory Café

Friends of Horwich Memory Cafe in Bolton. Memory cafes offer a friendly, relaxed and welcoming setting where those living with Dementia, their families and carers can drop in to access information, support and take part in activities.

They offer the opportunity for people sharing circumstances and living in similar situations to share experiences and find out how, and where, to get help and learn and share coping strategies.

Knowing that others really do understand can make a huge difference with the café providing a setting where those living with dementia can continue to feel welcomed and valued.

“We created a Transport Fund and organised trips and days out for dementia sufferers and their carers. These included trips to Llandudno and Fleetwood which were very successful. The award allowed us to hire a 54-seat coach on each occasion and provide free transport!

We received excellent feedback following the trip to Fleetwood and a mixed reaction to the Llandudno trip which we will learn from and take into consideration when planning future trips.”



Trafford Veterans

Trafford Veterans provide peer support and a wide range of activities for armed forces and emergency service veterans, their families and members of the local community.

Many of those supported have no family, or family members close by and often rely on the help of others for support, with usual activities providing additional opportunities for social engagement.

The impact of Covid-19 meant that many normal activities such as the Breakfast Club, Craft Group and Walking Football were suspended. However, Trafford Veterans utilised their assets and used their minibus to deliver fresh food, groceries, puzzle books, wool and reading materials to support both their members, elderly residents, those with existing health conditions and limited finances.

They also established a 'Phone Tree', hosted weekly email quizzes and kept the craft group going via Skype as well as providing use of their minibus to support local charities transporting foods to food hubs and distribution points as well as essential food and supplies to ex-service personnel and older people across Trafford.

"Our award allowed us to provide a number of peer support activities which tackled loneliness and social isolation and we were delighted to be able to receive the funds to make these activities possible. As a result, people have learned new crafting skills, and some have come forwards to run sessions and classes for the craft group and we would like to say thank you for your kind support."



Cancer Care Disapora

Cancer Care Diaspora organise activities aimed at normalising conversations about cancer in Black African and wider BME communities across Greater Manchester.

The group provides information, advice and signposting for individuals, carers and families. They also run weekly fitness sessions, support groups and coffee mornings as well as providing home and hospital visits for patients undergoing chemotherapy treatments.

"We were able to visit many sufferers both at home and in hospital. We also organised weekly shopping support and group meetings for cancer sufferers and their families/carers to come together for a nice cuppa and a friendly chat.

The support we provide to our community is very important, we also have new cases and referrals every week, but never enough in the way of resources, office space or the financial freedom to fully do what is required, which is a big task.

Receiving this Auto Trader Award from Forever Manchester was amazing as it enabled us to do many of the things we were struggling to achieve in the weeks and months prior to receipt. Thank You for supporting small organisations like ours with grants and awards to kick off and sustain their projects, you are doing a great job in our community."



Jigsaw Bolton Stroke Group

The Jigsaw Bolton Stroke Group is dedicated to promoting confidence in stroke survivors through socialisation and friendship.

The group also provide support and advice to survivors and their carers and utilise the facilities of a local church hall for meetings alongside organising occasional trips and social outings for pleasure and enjoyment.

The group provides a positive, light-hearted environment where both survivors, and carers, can meet up to chat and enjoy a range of social activities including quizzes, speeches, entertainment and organised meals in nice restaurants, and occasional outings such as canal trips.

“As we are entirely funded by grants, donations and member contributions, it was a great relief to receive this award towards the cost of our annual Christmas Luncheon, which is the highlight of our calendar and enjoyed by all. While the provision of disabled facilities is essential for the well-being of our members, the cost of attending would have been prohibitive for many without this funding.

We have learned so much from our members, their positivity, stoicism and ingenuity alongside the generosity of our volunteers for their commitment, care and ongoing support of all our members. “



Wonderfully Made Woman

Based in Ardwick and Miles Platting, Wonderfully Made Woman provide holistic support to help build the confidence of women and girls from Black, Asian, Minority Ethnic and Refugee (BAMER) communities to help them thrive.

Mainly working with African and Asian women in Manchester, Wonderfully Made Woman often stand as the first point of contact for women experiencing domestic abuse but not knowing what to do or having the confidence to speak out.

The group host a wide range of community activities including weekly dance and arts & crafts sessions, coffee mornings and days out. They host confidence building sessions including a number of awareness workshops with a focus on issues such as domestic abuse, female genital mutilation and hate crime. Wonderfully Made Women are also part of the BAMER research advisory group for The University of Manchester’s research into reducing health inequalities.

“As most of the women do not work, this award made a huge difference. It gave them the opportunity to come out and network with others. As a group we rely solely on volunteers and our work would be even more challenging if we didn’t get this kind of funding support.

You have supported us for many years now and this award made us very happy. We appreciate you and pray that you to continue to support other smaller organisation to achieve their aims.”



Brink Productions

Brink Productions provide young people with opportunities to take part in creative projects. Brink uses music, performance and multimedia as a method to both engage young people and offer them a voice.

The group works hard to reduce the risk of exclusion by proactively engaging young people in the planning, design and delivery of projects and sessions. Often working with those experiencing isolation or feeling removed from their community, Brink aims to reduce the feelings of isolation and loneliness with free activities and access to learning. These sessions provide a safe space to explore relevant issues including sexual health, self-harm, self-confidence, domestic violence, abuse and exploitation.

“This award enabled us to offer free activities to inspire local children & young people to engage in street dance activities and in turn, this helped to remove barriers to participation. The funding not only allowed us to rent suitable space but equally enabled us to source other funding opportunities to ensure continued provision of our street dance activities.

Many attendees experience financial disadvantage and therefore charging for these sessions would have excluded many young people in the area. However, the street dance sessions enabled us to create more partnerships, leading to more activities to positively engage more young people. They are grateful for the sessions, and we are equally grateful for the support we have received.”



Gorton Visual Arts

Gorton Visual Arts provide opportunities for older people and people with learning difficulties to gain new skills and work alongside professional artists on various arts projects.

The group provide opportunities that encourage a wide diversity of practices and inter-generational activities to embrace inclusion, social cohesion and self-worth and generate work with an edge, while creating a better understanding between older people and all aspects of the wider community.

As a community-focused arts facility, Gorton Visual Arts explore and share new ways of working together for people to gain new skills and learning.

“This award enabled us to continue our work - without it we would have had to stop, and this would mean turning people away and losing momentum, which is not healthy.

One of our volunteers provided one-to-one support for local residents with learning difficulties. It was great to witness the increased confidence and skills development of local residents being involved in activities that created a real "sense of ownership" within the group.”
